WINTER

Pedunculate oak sheds its leaves

Sort the garden shed and seed box, clean garden tools, reflect on the gardening year, and plan the garden and beds for next year.



Change Color

LATE AUTUMN Pedunculate Oak Leaves

Install frost protection, plant fruit shrubs, fertilize beds with compost, and

prepare and distribute winter bird feed.



MID AUTUMN Pedunculate Oak Fruits

Plant early-blooming bulbs, plant fruit shrubs and fruit trees, dig up non-winter-hardy plants, maintain the garden pond, and mow the lawn.



EARLY SPRING

Blooming Hazel

Remove dead plant parts, mulch the beds, sow summer flowers, start cultivation in protected cultivation, and prune fruit trees and fruit shrubs.



MID SPRING

Blooming Forsythia

Care for roses, plant frost-hardy perennials and herbs, sow summer flowers and winterhardy vegetables, and prune berry bushes and fruit trees.



LATE SPRING

Blooming Apple Trees

Carry out further sowing and planting of onion sets, bring container plants out of their winter quarters, and transplant seedlings of heat-loving



EARLY SUMMER

Blooming Black Elder Berry

Mow the lawn, transplant seedlings and non-frost-hardy perennials, direct sowing outdoors, mulch the beds and weed, and harvest the first crops.



MID SUMMER

Flowering Large Leaved Lime

Pre-cultivate winter vegetables, perform summer pruning of fruit trees, harvest, prune roses, mulch, and water if necessary.



EARLY AUTUMN Black Elder Berry Fruits

Harvest and preserve produce, create new beds, place nesting aids for birds, sow green manure, plant winter crops in the beds, and trim hedges.



LATE SUMMER Early Apple Varieties Are Riped

Direct sowing of winter crops, harvesting and preserving produce, and turning compost.
